



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# Developing THE FUTURE OF EDUCATION

The Centennial Academy story is about adaptability, innovation, resilience and success.



In 1969, teachers John Parker and Jim Logan expanded their tutoring business into a new type of high school. After continually adapting their methods to meet different challenges faced by their students, Parker and Logan concluded every student can succeed, with the right teaching.

Parker and Logan discovered the power of **predictable routines and consistent structures in a positive and caring learning environment**. Teaching methods are continually adapted to suit the evolving needs of students. These principles underpin Centennial Academy's approach to teaching.



By 1998, major Québec curriculum reforms shifted the focus from rote memorization to analysis, synthesis, problem solving and critical thinking. While this significantly raised the bar, it also led to rising stress and anxiety for high school students.

We responded by looking to neuroscience for answers: by working with the adolescent brain, to reduce unnecessary stresses, students can succeed by maximizing learning. Using this innovative approach, students with diagnosed learning disabilities, such as ADHD, autism spectrum disorder, dyslexia, and anxiety disorder, are able to master their learning challenges, follow the rigorous curriculum and graduate on time.



The Prud'homme Avenue building was our home for 41 years. When the lease expired in 2017, it was a struggle to find a suitable facility. We moved several times before finding our new centrally located home in the west wing of the historic Grand Séminaire de Montréal complex in downtown Montréal.

Originally a residence for seminarians, the building required extensive and expensive renovations to transform into a modern school. Savings and a bank loan facilitated the year-long transformation. Further delays were caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

After three years of instability, we officially opened the doors to our new home on September 30, 2020.



Despite setbacks and challenges, our enrolment has grown by 30% since 2016 to a target of 255 students by June 2021

Answering high demand from the francophone population, we introduced a French-language stream in 2016 with six Grade 7 students. In five years, the francophone program has grown to more than one-third of our total enrolment, across five grades. 2021 celebrates the first French graduating class.

No other high school in Quebec does what we do: teach students with learning challenges the tools they need to graduate with a Diploma of Secondary Studies within five years, without the help of parents or outside tutors.

Does our approach work? The results speak for themselves:

- 95% of our students have a diagnosed learning disability.
- 90% of our students graduate in five years and go on to college or university. This compares to the provincial graduation rate of 69% for public and private schools combined.



## Delivering THE FUTURE OF EDUCATION

Centennial Academy's approach is based on creating confidence and competence in students. When William and Sophie succeed, the more they believe they can.

Based on Universal Design for Learning principles, William and Sophie and their classmates are treated with respect and supported by built-in accommodations which reduce stress, embed consistency and promote success.

Students are valued for who they are and how they learn.

Students are assigned seats in one classroom with a maximum of 20 students; teachers move from class to class.

School runs on a predictable, consistent and comforting Monday-to-Friday schedule.

 Teaching is adapted to student needs, so students are fully engaged in the learning.

Homework is posted in each classroom and online in a consistent platform for all staff and students.

We collect data daily about learning behaviours to improve overall results.

"This gift of normalcy in a time that is anything but, is deeply appreciated. We have seen an **incredible transformation** in our son. He is clearly engaged at school. He's managing to stay on top of the work set, and most importantly every day he is happy to be going to school. These are all HUGE achievements. We have seen his self-confidence and pride soar. The stress levels in our house are so much lower as a result of his new-found equilibrium at school. It has made a huge difference to all of us. We are delighted."

We build resilient learners by partnering with parents. Through routine, predictability, and healthy balanced lifestyles, students are calmer at home and at school and more able to learn.

Parents are asked to promote strong sleep habits in students and minimize overstimulation from technology devices:

- Maximum one hour per day on devices; two hours on weekends.
- No technology one hour before bedtime.
- Minimum four hours of physical activity per week.




#### Economics OF THE FUTURE OF EDUCATION


The 21st century requires knowledge workers who think critically, problem solve, analyze and synthesize. There are fewer unskilled jobs in the marketplace.

**Centennial Academy fills a void** for students with learning challenges who are destined to drop out of public schools and add a cost burden to society. By keeping students in school and teaching them the tools they need to graduate, we reduce the cost to society for untrained high-school dropouts.

A study by the *Chamber of Commerce of Metropolitan Montréal* and *Réseau réussite Montréal* showed the enormous impact dropouts have on the economy. In 2019:

- One in every six Montreal youth dropped out of high school before graduating.
- Dropouts in Montreal earn an average of \$34,485, more than 31% less than the average high school graduate. 30% of dropouts do not join the workforce.
- Two-thirds of social assistance program recipients are dropouts. That equates to \$2 billion in social assistance payments.
- 62% of people who pass through the prison system are dropouts.
- Dropouts are more likely to suffer from health problems and have a shorter life expectancy by seven years, compared to high school graduates.
- Dropouts cost the Quebec economy \$593 million annually.





#### Strengthening YOUR COMMUNITY

## Building SUSTAINABLE SUCCESS

Servicing our debt focuses us on catching up rather than looking forward to helping more families and implementing our vision of creating a centre of excellence, sharing our methods across the province and around the world.


The first step: **retire our debt**. The burden of debt threatens our sustainability which limits the number of families who can get their children back.

If you help us get out from under the burden of constricted resources, we can deploy resources to expand our enrolment in both English and French streams to help more families. We can rent more space in our building and hire and train more staff to service the demand.

There is a clear pathway to increase our enrolment to 400 students, and eventually to double the number of students we serve in the coming years. This means more help will be available to families who are desperate for a way out of their chaos.

Then, we can develop a centre of excellence, training teacher teams to implement the Centennial model in other schools. This starts with retraining teachers to focus on positive, predictable and consistent methods in a defined organizational structure. The potential for expanding this approach worldwide is enormous.





### Maximizing OUR PERMANENT HOME

Leasing, refurbishing and outfitting our new home was an expensive and time-consuming project. Despite the upheaval, our resilient learners and outstanding staff forged ahead and are now focusing all their attention on learning.

Our Board made the fiscally responsible decision to lease our new building rather than take on the added expense of building a new building. We've refurbished this beautiful historic building and completed many enhancements, including upgraded technology which means every student receives a laptop for learning.

But maximizing our facilities is dependent on completing outstanding upgrades, including:

- finishing the gymnasium with window cages and lights and erecting a separation wall from the rest of the building;
- purchasing SMART boards to outfit all classrooms;
- books and furniture for our new library;
- comfortable furniture for the student lounges and free spaces.

Our new home is financially viable and sustainable for the long term – once the purchase and refurbishment debt are retired.
